Matthew is an organized problem-solver. I joke that Matthew is the Microsoft Excel to my Microsoft Paint. I think he gets a lot of joy in the process of solving problems and making others' lives better. Our family has felt the benefits of Matthew's problem-solving skills first hand. One night, my mom's partner, Thom, was missing. We were all very worried. Matthew immediately stepped up and organized a plan, calling around to local hospitals. When we found Thom, he was in the hospital for a bad car accident. Matthew didn't stop there. He investigated the crash and handled paperwork so my mom could focus on taking care of Thom. Your child will have a dad who will not just help solve their problems but teach them the skills needed to set up goals to achieve their dreams.
