


Who We Are


Meet Kerry By: Mike

After a sailboat race, when Mike gets off the water, the energy that surrounds him is captivating and inviting. You can feel his passion as he shares his stories of the start lines of a sailboat race at large world event. In New Orleans, over 80 sailboats crisscrossed each other behind an imaginary start line. When the time sequence began to count down, then at the final horn, all 80 sailboats turned their boats 45 degrees and took off in the wind. On the sailboat, Mike tells these stories as he passes his sailing knowledge to his nieces and nephews, just like his father and uncle did for him.





Many people are good sailors, but Mike is a great sailor. To be a great sailor, you need to be calm. His calmness extends beyond sailing to his other passion, **scuba diving**. Mike will tell you that swimming below the surface is **tranquil and full of adventure**. A favorite scuba story is when Mike was exploring a coral reef 45 feet below the surface. 




Deekdays
