
Hello



We look forward to learning about your favorite traditions so we can include them in our gatherings with your child.

Each December we have a family reunion with all of our extended family, second cousins and great aunts and uncles. The young children exchange gifts with each other, and the adults have their own **White Elephant gift exchange**. The White Elephant gift exchange always starts with a debate on what the rules are and are inevitably different each year. Family Recipe

Lefse

Ingredients

5 pounds Russet potatoes

1/2 cup sweet cream

1 tsp salt

3 tablespoons butter, melted

1 tablespoon white sugar

2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

Directions

- 1. Cook potatoes in skins (without salt)
- 2. Peel and rice with hot.
- 3. Add creatm, salt and butter and mix well
- 4. Cool overnight in refrigerator (Do not cover)
- 5. Add 1 cup flour to 3 cups potatoes and roll into balls (1/3 cup in size)
- 6. Sprinkle flour on rolling pin and roll out balls until thin and bake on lefse grill
- 7. When taking off grill, stack up on damp towel
- 8. Then take each one and lay flat, then turn over before folding
- 9. Use bread board under hot lefse
- 10. Spread butter over lefse and sprinkle with sugar. Roll up and serve
